  for unused speaker's time), but ONLY IN THE DEDICATED DISCUSSION
  segment at the end of every segment.
- Please only present either NEW DATA or NEW HYPOTHESES.
- Prepare a presentation of NO MORE THAN FIVE SLIDES WITHOUT ANY ANIMATION (except for video) for the live presentation (see <u>sample</u> PPTX).
- Prepare and SUBMIT YOUR PRESENTATION IN ADVANCE (see below), because your personal laptops should NOT be used.
- DO NOT PRESENT BACKGROUND or introductory slides; they are likely
  not required for this audience and take away precious time from your
  talk. If you have background or introductory slides or a longer
  presentation already prepared that you would like the participants to
  see, you can send it to us for inclusion in the password-protected course
  material website, visible only to registered participants.
- There will be no speaker prep room and no technical support onsite. To avoid delay setting up private computers, you MUST please SEND US YOUR PRESENTATION BEFOREHAND (confidentiality assured), using <a href="www.wetransfer.com">www.wetransfer.com</a> (NOT email) to <a href="tutschek@me.com">tutschek@me.com</a> NO LATER THAN Friday, 5 January 2020, 24:00 hrs.
  In PowerPoint make sure to EMBED VIDEOS (DO NOT LINK to them), otherwise they will not be available. We will check your presentation for technical issue and make it available on the presenter PC in the lecture room.
